A deaf christian lady in New Jersey contacted me, informing me that her ex husband was in a hospital in Philadelphia and wanted me to visit him. I met her there and tried to talk with him. He had stage 4 cancer and just had a stroke. Because of the stroke, he was not able to sign clearly, only with very limited movements. One of his eyes was turned sideways so I wasn't sure if he was able to look at me as I was sharing the Gospel with him. My prayer was that he would be able to understand me and ask God for salvation from his heart. After staying for a while and meeting with the rest of the family members, I returned home. His ex wife informed me later that she spoke with him and asked if he accepted Jesus and he weakly signed "Yes." A few days later, he passed away.
