We were not able to do anything about it earlier because it would easily cost us about ten grand to do the walls. My wife became good friends with one family from the hearing church (the building we rent from) whose husband owns a concrete business. He came up to us and offered to do it for the cost of supplies. The fact that we were quite surprised is an understatement. He came once a week for five weeks and our basements walls look brand new. We feel much more secure with the walls supporting our house now. This was definitely a big and unexpected blessing for us.

We had a small New Years Eve fellowship at our home. It's not something we do every year but our church wanted one this year. We had a small group who came over and celebrated with us. It was a blessing to fellowship especially with those who would have been alone at home instead.
